Meeting Notes:

After introductions, overview, and discussion of the Workshop Purpose

PG&E moved to present on the <u>Updated Joint IOU Valuation Methodology</u> that has incorporated comments from <u>Subgroup A</u>.

- CPUC: Is there a specific reason we are focusing solely on California and not looking to the work done in other states or countries?
 - PG&E: The technological feasibility of the timeframe specified for analysis (2019-2022) was part of the limiting scope. Identifying successful applications in other areas would be a great opportunity, if the information is available.
- CEC: One important factor for Subgroup B in determining costs will be determining relative cost without releasing technological or business model proprietary information through the bidding process.
- Public Advocate's Office: How does the Working Group intend to address cost comparison of use cases through absolute cost or incremental costs? Will the end result be a full cost accounting or a relative ranking?
 - PG&E: Looking to provide a basic ranking methodology. The incremental aspect
 of cost should be embedded in all of the use cases by looking at the value of VGI
 relative to a reference case.
- CPUC: Will overall market potential be evaluated for use cases that continue through the methodology?
 - SCE: It seems likely that the Working Group could provide a rough idea of projected market size.
