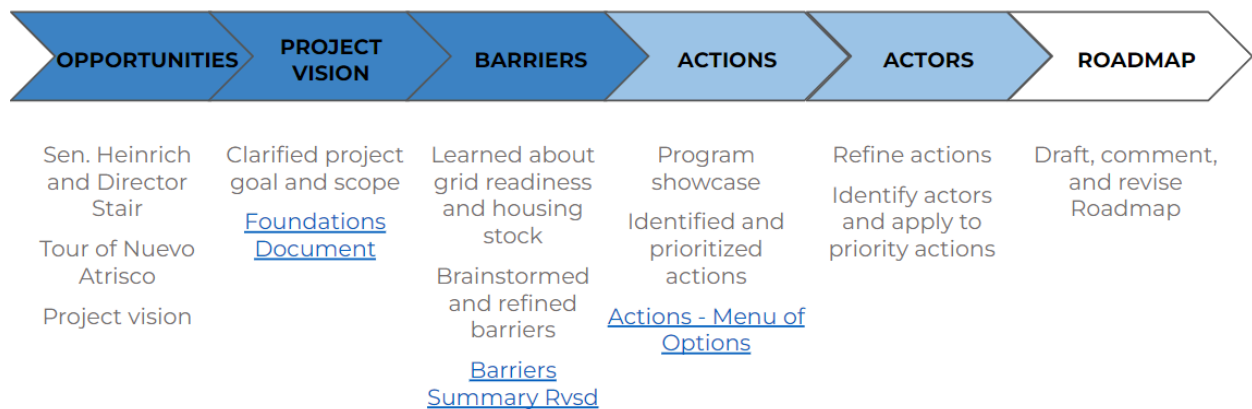
Welcome and objectives

Gridworks opened the meeting, provided an overview of the agenda, and discussed the meeting's objectives:

- To refresh project status
- To work collaboratively to refine priority actions
- To identify actors and apply to priority actions

Project Recap

Given the August break, Gridworks refreshed project steps for participants. Gridworks discussed project development using the following illustration:





Priority Actions

Gridworks reviewed the development of Roadmap key elements: barriers, goals, and actions, and highlighted the six actions participants identified as priorities:

1. Tariff on-bill financing
2. Free technology training for licensed trades
3. Clean heat standard
4. Point of sale incentives
5. Beneficial electrification rate
6. Grid modernization and distribution system upgrades

Breakout Discussions: Refining Priority Actions

The group broke into two rounds of breakout room discussions to focus on priority actions. Volunteers who worked on priority action development in August shared their work and discussed ideas with breakout room participants. Gridworks captured discussion notes [here](#).

Identifying Actors

For the last hour of the meeting, participants returned to the whole group to identify actors who are important to the success of the priority actions. The group brainstormed categories of actors (e.g. educational/training institutions, state agencies, etc.) and identified which entities must be engaged to implement the priority actions (see [slide 12](#)).

Meeting Recap and Poll

Gridworks closed the meeting, summarizing the day's progress and identifying next steps. Unfortunately, due to budget constraints, no future meetings are planned at this time. Gridworks will assemble work products to date and forward to the Building Decarbonization Coalition and Natural Resources Defense Council (work products shown in blue text in Project Recap above).

In lieu of further meetings, Gridworks polled participants to assess their level of support for each priority action. 13 participants responded with results shown below:
